City of Mount Dora temporarily suspending events

Mount Dora, Fla. (March 12, 2020) – Out of an abundance of caution, the City of Mount Dora is temporarily suspending events in the city. The suspension affects the following: Downtown areas, including all city parks, Sunset Park downtown, alleyways and other city facilities and the W.T. Bland Public Library.

The health and wellness of our residents and visitors is a priority for the city and following the guidelines set forth by the CDC for social distancing, the city believed the best practice would be to postpone events until a later date and time.

Taste In Mount Dora, along with the *Mount Dora 110* celebration, which were scheduled for this coming weekend, have been postponed until a later date, which will be announced.

Spring Festival, which was a festival scheduled for the weekend of March 21-22, has been postponed until a later date as well. For more information about the festival, please contact Visit Mount Dora.

All programming at the W.T. Bland Public Library for March has been cancelled, including the AARP Tax Aide program, which will be rescheduled for a later date. The library will be open for book circulation.

“The City of Mount Dora will support and follow the recommendations of Lake County and our Governor as we navigate the challenges created by the Coronavirus,” said Mayor Cathy Hoechst. “We want our residents and visitors to feel safe when in Mount Dora, so at this time, we believe it to be prudent to postpone any gatherings that bring people together on our streets and parks.”

The city parks will remain open for the public to use, but all events scheduled at the parks are postponed.
